



Day 01 : DELHI ARRIVAL

- Upon arrival at airport you will be assisted by our representative to transfer you to your hotel.
- Delhi is India's capital and a city of two halves. Old Delhi – the heart of Muslim India between the 17th and 19th centuries – is famous for its grand mosques, majestic forts and crumbling monuments. In contrast New Delhi, is epitomized British Colonial Capital, famous for its large government buildings, wide tree-lined avenues and pretty white-washed bungalows and remains the epicentre of Indian political power.

Day 02 : DELHI (FULL DAY)

- After breakfast - Sightseeing of Old Delhi - visit landmarks like Red Fort, Raj Ghat (memorial to Mahatma Gandhi), Jama Masjid (the largest mosque in India) and drive past Chandini Chowk.
- Walk through Chandni Chowk to savour the ambience of an oriental bazaar.
- Later continue of sightseeing of New Delhi. Visit the 12th century Qutab Minar (a 234ft hand-carved monument), and the 1500 year old iron pillar which is still not rusted. Visit the Humayun's Tomb. Drive past the India Gate (a war memorial dedicated the Indian soldiers), the President's Residence - formerly the Viceroy's Palace, Parliament House and the Secretariat buildings (famous colonial buildings converted to government offices).

Day 03 : DELHI - AJMER/PUSHKAR

- After breakfast drive for ancient historic city of Ajmer, in the desert State of Rajasthan. Ajmer has been home to many dynasties, which have left an undeniable mark of their culture and traditions as well as converting it to an amalgamation of Hinduism and Islamic cultures.
- Later visit Pushkar, an enchanting small town located on the lake Pushkar oasis on the edge of the desert but is separated from it by Nag Pahar, the Snake Mountain. It is famous for its Brahma temple, bathing ghats and the unique annual animal fair.

Day 04 : AJMER - UDAIPUR

- After breakfast drive to the lake city of Udaipur – famous for its palaces, lakes, well-tended gardens and the endless green hills, Udaipur is one of Rajasthan's most attractive cities. In evening enjoy boat ride at Lake Pichola.

Day 05 : UDAIPUR

- Morning visit Eklingji a hindu temple complex near Udaipur, patronized by the mewar kings.
- Later visit the impressive City Palace (owned by the Maharaja of Udaipur), overlooking Lake Pichola. Places of interest here include the Mor Chowk court, Manak Mahal, Chini-Ki-Chitra Mahal and the Queen's Palace. Also visit the Fateh Prakash Palace and its unique Crystal Gallery and grand Durbar Hall. From the City Palace return on foot to the old town and the intricately carved Jagdish Mandir temple.

Day 06 : UDAIPUR - JODHPUR

- Morning drive into the aravali hills to visit the 15th century spectacular Jain temple at Ranakpur, noted for its outstanding marble sculptures and inlay work on marble.
- Continue on to Jodhpur (the blue city), the second largest city of Rajasthan, founded in 1459 by Rao Jodha.

Day 07 : JODHPUR - JAIPUR

- Morning city tour - Visit the famous Mehrangarh Fort, Jaswant Thada and the Umaid Bhavan Palace. Afternoon drive to the historical and beautiful capital of Rajasthan - Jaipur (the Pink City). The city was founded in 1728 by Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II, the ruler of Amber.

Day 08 : JAIPUR

- This morning drive outside of Jaipur to the dramatically located Amber Fort set on a ridge above the rugged surrounding hills. It was the Rajput capital for over 700 years - famous for courtyard gardens and small temples.
- In the afternoon return to Jaipur to visit the City Palace complex and the famous Hawa Mahal, or 'Palace of the Winds' and the Jantar Mantar—the largest stone observatory in the world.

Day 09 : JAIPUR - AGRA

- After breakfast drive to Agra, visit Abhaneri / chand baori – the deepest step-well in the world, followed by a visit to the famous sandstone monument, the Fatehpur Sikri and then continue to Agra. Agra in Uttar Pradesh is home to three magnificent buildings - Agra Fort, the Tomb of Itmad-ud-daula and the Taj Mahal (one of the seven wonders of the world).

Day 10 : AGRA - DELHI

- Morning - Visit the imposing Agra Fort, established by the Mughal Emperor Akbar in 1565, and the tomb of Itmad-ud-Daula and finally the magnificent Taj Mahal, arguably the greatest monument to love, built by Shah Jahan as a memorial to his wife Mumtaz.
- Later leave the Taj Mahal and return by road to Delhi Airport towards your onward journey with sweet memories.
