

Day 3: Rotorua (2 nights)



The city of Rotorua has been a spa town since the 1800s, thanks to the many geysers, hot springs and mud pools that can be found in what is one of the world's most active geothermal fields. The Maori, who considered the region sacred, make up 35% of the population and a popular attraction is discovering their rich culture and traditions. Rotorua is surrounded by lakes, mountains, forests and other natural features that afford visitors the opportunity to try out a number of outdoor activities between relaxing sessions in the hot springs and pools.

Te Puia

Te Puia is New Zealand's living Maori cultural centre, located just 5 minutes from central Rotorua. Situated in the Whakarewarewa Geothermal Valley, Te Puia's 60 hectare site is home to the New Zealand Maori Arts and Crafts Institute, a live kiwi enclosure, the world-famous Pohutu Geyser, and more than 500 geothermal wonders.

With land steeped in ancestral history, and a guiding legacy that stretches back to the 1800s, Te Puia extend their unique hospitality and rich cultural heritage to all visitors.





Rainbow Springs Kiwi Wildlife Park

The entire experience is built around New Zealand's largest and most successful kiwi conservation center. Since 1995 we have released over 1,200 kiwis into the wild. Added to this intimate view of one of the world's living treasures, you will also be able to experience the adrenaline rush of The Big Splash, explore many free flight aviaries, feed the birds their breakfast, come face to face with pre-history in the eyes of many tuatara, talk to Jenny the hand-reared kea, feed the largest wild trout you will ever see, experience the wonder of the bird show featuring some of the funniest feathered performers you will ever see.

Not only that, because your ticket is valid for repeat entry for the day of the purchase you can come back at night to listen to the bird calls and to watch the kiwi come out to play. With no glass in the outdoor kiwi enclosure, and only a knee high fence separating you from these curious native birds, you can get closer to kiwi than you ever thought possible.







Agrodome

In the heart of 350 acres of lush farmland, yet only 10 minutes from Rotorua city center, you'll find New Zealand's Agrodome. For over 40 years, visitors from all over the globe have come to the Agrodome to see the world-famous Farm Show, starring a cast of talented animals... and you! Plus, join the Farm Tour to explore a real working farm, hand-feed loads of friendly animals, and sample delicious kiwifruit juice and honey from the land. There's also the Nursery, with baby animals available for cuddles and photos all year round, and the Woollen Mill and Shearing Museum, where you'll learn the remarkable story of NZ pioneers the Bowen brothers, and discover the full process of wool from the Sheep's back to yours! The Agrodome is one of New Zealand's must-see attractions, open in any weather, 365 days a year!!







Day 5: Queenstown (3 nights)



Queenstown is situated on the shores of Lake Wakatipu and has stunning views of the surrounding alpine peaks. Considered by many as one of the world's adventure capitals, it offers visitors a wide selection of adrenaline-boosting activities to choose from, such as bungee jumping, white water rafting, zip lining, skiing and skydiving. 

Milford Sound

Milford sound, New Zealand's most well-known tourist destination, is not really a sound at all but a fjord as it was created by a succession of glaciers which carved through the rocks as they gouged a track to the sea leaving in their wake the impressive rock formations visible today. Home to some diverse and particularly unusual wildlife including fur seals and crested penguins, as well as bottlenose and dusky dolphins, this geographical gem is a must-see for nature lovers. With the striking Mitre Peak towering over head, sheer rocky cliffs rise vertically out of the calm dark waters while nearby, the waters of the exquisite Bowen Falls plunge down a 520-foot drop before crashing dramatically into the fjord below. With its remarkable geographical setting and it's unbelievable abundance of wildlife, it is easy to see why writer Rudyard Kipling once called Milford Sound the "eighth natural wonder of the world."



Travel Information

SOME BASIC TRAVEL TIPS

What to Pack

- · In New Zealand, be prepared for weather that can turn suddenly and temperatures that vary greatly from day to night, particularly at the change of seasons
- · There's a good chance you'll need warm clothing in New Zealand no matter what the season
- · New Zealand's weather is as ever-changing as its landscape, so pack layers of all-weather clothing, from T-shirts to good warm sweaters and jackets
- · Wear layers, you'll appreciate being able to remove or put on a jacket
- A windbreaker is a good idea to carry along
- · Always carry comfortable walking shoes & take an extra pair along
- Take along a light raincoat and/or umbrella
- · Bring a hat with a brim to provide protection from the strong sunlight and sunglasses for either summer or winter as the glare on snow and glaciers can be intense
- New Zealanders dress casually, so don't worry about fashion over function
- · Many shops will sell lightweight and mid-weight merino wool garments, which are expensive but breathe, keep you warm, and don't trap body odour, making them ideal attire for any kind of activity
- The country has high-quality outdoor stores, as well as fashion boutiques, so it is easy to pick up items here.
- · Be certain to pack your electronics, as they are expensive and elusive in New Zealand
- · Clean your shoes, boots, tents, golf clubs, bicycles, and luggage before you arrive (or it could be quarantined for cleaning)
- Don't wear lotions or perfume in humid places like Southland, Stewart Island, either, because they attract mosquitoes and other bugs
- Carry insect repellent in summer
- · Avoid wearing black and dark blue colours in humid and beach areas in Summer as Sand flies seem drawn to these colours

Tipping

- · Tipping is not as widely practiced in New Zealand as in the United States or Europe or India
- · Good service in New Zealand is given because the person means it, not because they're aiming for a good tip



- However in city restaurants and hotels it's appreciated if you acknowledge good service with a 10% tip
- Tour guides and drivers would also be used to receiving some gesture, even though it isn't mandatory
- · Taxi drivers will appreciate rounding up the fare to the nearest NZ\$5 amount, but don't feel you have to do this
- · Porters will be happy with a NZ\$1 or NZ\$2 coin
- · Most other people, like bartenders, theatre attendants, gas-station attendants, or barbers, will probably wonder what you are doing if you try to give them a tip

CUSTOMS & DUTIES

- · New Zealand has stringent regulations governing the import of weapons, foodstuffs, and certain plant and animal material
- Do not bring more than 50 Cigarettes or 50 grams of loose tobacco DUTY FREE
- Any extra cigarettes or tobacco will be confiscated and destroyed
- · Anti-drug laws are strict and penalties severe
- · You are allowed duty-free, 4.5 litres of wine (Six, 750ml bottles) three bottles of spirits or liquor of more than more than 1,125 ml each

More stringent is the agricultural & food quarantine

- Don't carry fresh fruits or food items, throw them in the amnesty bin given if you have any on you
- Leave all food given in the aircraft behind
- · If you must bring food, carry only dry food items, such as dry ready to eat products that have been fully cooked
- · You can bring ready to eat pre-packaged foods, snacks & pickles
- \cdot Do not carry any grains, legumes or any dry food items that need to be cooked to be eaten and/or can be used to make sprouts
- · All camping and hiking gear must be declared and inspected at customs
- · Make sure any outdoor sports & camping equipment are thoroughly clean when entering the country
- Be truthful about outdoor gear (golf, hiking, camping, etc.) because they will check for grass, earth and muck
- Most importantly declare everything on your arrival card &
- · If you are unsure, simply declare it on the arrival card
- · An official will ask what you're declaring and if it's okay (like chocolate, for example), he'll send you straight through
- · All bags coming into the country are X-rayed



· You'll be hit with an instant NZ\$250 fine if you're caught bringing in undeclared and unwanted goods like fruit and other items—those cute Beagles at customs will bark if they smell even a whiff of a banana

There aren't many places on this planet where travellers are so well catered for – in terms of both man-made enticements and splendours of the natural realm. New Zealand is bigger than the UK, with one-fourteenth the population size. Filling in the gaps are sublime forests, majestic mountains, and the stunning lakes, beaches and fiords that have made this country one of the best hiking (locals call it 'tramping') destinations on Earth. It's renowned worldwide for having a relaxed, friendly, spacious and outdoor adventure lifestyle (think sport, walks, BBQs, and beaches). When you combine this adventurous outlook with a stunning backdrop you start to see why travellers rate New Zealand as the action/adventure/adrenalin capital of the world!

Banking and Currency

Currency

New Zealand's unit of currency is the dollar (NZ\$). All major credit cards can be used in New Zealand, with Visa and MasterCard accepted most widely, followed by American Express and Diners Club.

Banking

New Zealand banks are open from 9.30am to 4.30pm Monday to Friday. Some are also during weekends. .

Automated Teller Machines (ATM) are widely available at banks, along main shopping streets and in malls.

International credit cards and ATM cards will work as long as they have a four-digit PIN encoded. Check with your bank before leaving home.

Climate and Weather

New Zealand has a largely temperate climate. While the far north has subtropical weather during summer, and inland alpine areas of the South Island can be as cold as - 10°C in winter, most of the country lies close to the coast, which means mild temperatures, moderate rainfall, and abundant sunshine.

Because New Zealand lies in the Southern Hemisphere, the average temperature decreases as you travel south. The far north of the country has an average temperature of about 15°C, while the deep south has a cooler 9°C average. January and February are the warmest months of the year, and July is the coldest.

Clothing and Dress Recommendations

New Zealand is typically an informal place so pack casually for comfort.

Famous for having four seasons in one day; our advice if you are traveling even in the summer is to pack a light jacket or pashmina shawl just in case the weather turns cooler or if you're visiting higher altitudes. You can also expect some rain, so include a light raincoat.

Smart casual clothes are acceptable at most restaurants and night-spots.

New Zealand is renowned for its outdoor activities, so make sure you take swimming gear, hiking shoes, trekking pants/shorts, sunhat and sunglasses, as well as plenty of sunscreen

If you plan to do much walking then lightweight walking shoes or sneakers are fine.



Electricity and Plug Standards

New Zealand's electricity supply runs at 230/240 volts, and we use angled two or three pin plugs (the same as Australia). Most hotels and motels provide 110 volt ac sockets (rated at 20 watts) for electric razors only.
